Rotary President-Elect Ian Riseley of Australia, who was instrumental in the development of RLI in Australia, New Zealand and Oceania (ANZO), described his experiences with RLI at the RLI Breakfast Meeting on November 26, 2016 in Madrid, Spain. The RLI Breakfast was held at the Eurobuilding Hotel in Madrid in connection with the Rotary Institute for seven zones in Europe.

In the absence of the Chair of the event, PRID Jacques di Costanzo of France, RLI Regional Chair for Europe, due to an emergency medical situation in his family, the meeting was chaired by PDG Jose Ramon Echevarria, Chair of the RLI Spain Division. Other speakers were PDG Alain van de Poel of Belgium, RLI Regional Co-Chair for Europe and PRID David Linett, USA, the International RLI Chair. During a question and answer portion of the meeting, Linett also responded to a number of questions and comments from participants in the Breakfast. Linett also announced that RLI now has RLI programs in 33 countries in Europe with several more pending.

As announced in our November, 2016 eBulletin, the RLI Curriculum Meeting will be held on January 27-29, 2017 in Orlando, Florida. The great advantage of an international program of education for Rotary Club members is to be able to utilize the best ideas and practices of our far flung Rotary districts." Linett also said that consideration will be given in

the future to holding some of these meetings in various parts of the Rotary world.

The January meeting will be held at the Hilton Garden Inn Airport in Orlando, Florida, USA beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, January 27 and ending at noon on Sunday, January 29, 2017.
